## UK TO BECOME WORLD'S BIGGEST E-WASTE CONTRIBUTOR BY 2024

**Several studies suggest that the UK could become the world's largest e-waste contributor as early as 2024.**

Globally, the UK is currently the second largest contributor of e-waste at 23.9kg per capita. It follows the biggest contributor, Norway, which is responsible for 26kg of e-waste per capita each year.



Only **17%** of e-waste is properly collected and recycled

The rest ends up in landfill or is processed informally, posing a serious threat to the environment and human health





In the UK, there are estimated to be:

**11 million laptops**  
**9 million tablets**  
**6.5 million computers**

**With the potential to be sold or recycled**  
That's a lot of unused tech that could be re-homed

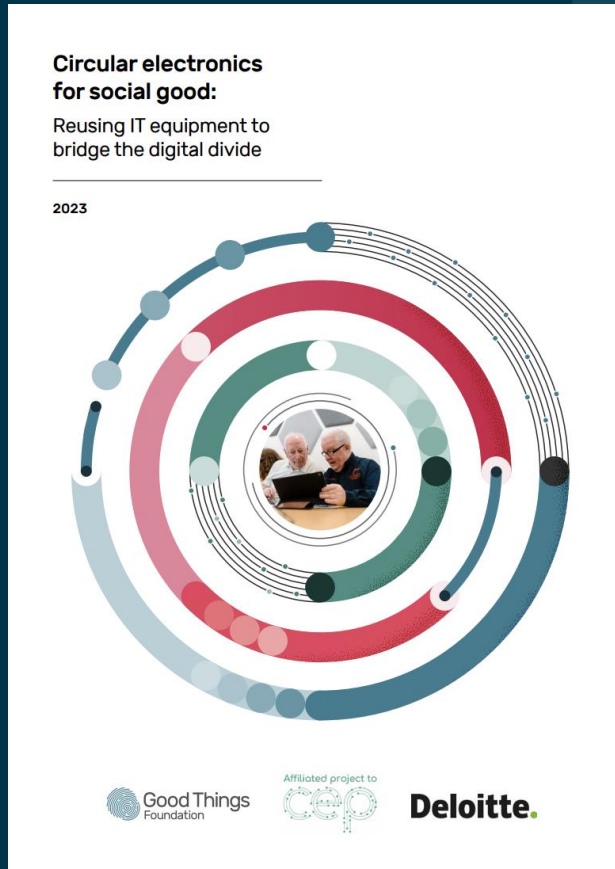
