

CPPC tailor-make our workshops to suit schools & college and have devised one specially for Newlyn Art Gallery & The Exchange in response to *Storm Warning*.

• Sessions approx 2hrs in length and will include a debate/discussion element.

The K52 workshops aim to actively engage the pupils in the session and develop:

- An appreciation of the extent of litter and debris in our sea, and around our Cornish coastline.
- An understanding of the different types of plastics that pollute our sea and our beaches, where they originate from, how long they persist in the environment, and the damage they can cause to wildlife.
- Increased awareness of the presence of microplastic pollution in the seas and how this enters the food chain

 A debate around the issue of 'Whose responsibility is it to do something about plastic pollution?' and what novel positive actions the students and schools can suggest to tackle things locally. Ideally each school would declare their own 'Pledge for the Planet' to take back to their whole school community.

CPPC deliver all presentations and workshops entirely for free If organisations or school wish to make a donation after the event to enable our volunteers to continue their environmental work it can be done a voluntary basis and it always very much appreciated All our education volunteers are DBS checked and very experienced and most are exteachers, TA's etc
