Mark Roberts: Boys Don't Try?

Boys Don't Try? What the research tells us about the causes and solutions to the gender attainment gap. Looking at the influence of teacher expectations, engagement strategies, peer pressure and relationships on boys' outcomes and attitudes to school.

Planning for improving boys' attainment. Considering what can be done by classroom teachers and school leaders to help delegates draw up clear action plans to address gender gaps.

Literacy focus: improving boys' writing. Focusing on the quality of extended writing and written communication, this session will offer practical solutions to develop boys in this crucial area.



Mark Roberts is assistant principal at a mixed 11-18 comprehensive school in Devon, where he leads on teaching and learning, and professional development. Before moving down south, he worked at an inner-city comprehensive for boys in Manchester.
